

## Poison-Dart Frog (*Dendrobates*)



Poison-dart frogs are native to streams and rivers from Nicaragua to Bolivia, the Guianas, and southeastern Brazil. Their skin glands contain poisons so toxic they can be life threatening for any animal that attempts to eat them. Indigenous communities use the poisons for hunting by coating their arrows with toxins extracted from the frog's skin.
